

CRCHC Expands Services in Mecklenburg County

Concord, NC – Cabarrus Rowan Community Health Centers has received \$350,000 from Mecklenburg County to enhance and expand services at Shelter Health Services.

The organization partners with Shelter Health Services to provide healthcare services through its mobile unit. Located in Charlotte, NC, Shelter Health Services is a free health clinic that provides healthcare and medical services to uninsured, medically indigent, homeless women and children living in poverty and residing in the Salvation Army Center of Hope. In response to their clientele's lack of income and health insurance, all services provided are free of charge, including nursing and provider care, diagnostic labs, tests and screens, prescriptions, vaccinations, and other healthcare services. Shelter Health Services' values are incorporated in presence, respect, information, services, movement, and 360 degree healthcare. Its network contains a lineup of various collaborations and partnerships. Shelter Health Services houses the largest concentration of homeless women and children in Mecklenburg County.

Because of funding from Mecklenburg County, CRCHC will now offer services 3 days a week including primary care, dental, and behavioral health. "We are very excited to expand our services with Shelter Health Services. Our mobile unit continues to bring access to care in the communities that we serve," CRCHC's CEO Don Holloman said. "We are truly committed to strengthening our community by providing quality care and providing each person with a system of comprehensive healthcare that promotes wellness, regardless of their ability to pay." said Holloman.
